Donations

Thank you to all our parents/carers who continue to donate liquid soaps, household antibacterial wipes and tissues. We very much appreciate you sending them into school. They are all used and will continue to be over the coming months.

Hand Creams

For those children in Key Stage 2 who have been prescribed hand creams and soaps to use, please make sure school are aware of them and you have completed the necessary medical authorisation forms. NYCC Health and Safety have provided updated guidance on using moisturising creams for children who are suffering with dry and sore hands but who do not need a prescribed medication. Children in Key Stage 2 can bring in a cream such as E45, to apply themselves in school. However parents must complete the appropriate authorisation form for pupils to administer the cream

themselves and pupils must keep the cream stored in their tray.

If you check some reviews online of children's soap, there is a discount supermarket, which sells a value bodywash for children, which is rated by parents for treating eczema and for sensitive skin and seems to work as well as more expensive products.

Talk to Read, Read to Talk

Research studies indicate that reading makes you smarter and helps to maintain your positive well being.

As we all get back into the routine of coming to school, we urge all our children to continue reading and sharing the love of reading with their families. Reading is not just the mechanical act of reading the words but the magic of reading a story together and talking about it. All children at the primary age are widening their vocabulary and they can only do this by having exposure to the spoken word. So you need to talk to read and read to talk. Model good reading by doing this with your children. Children emulate everything they see their parents/carers do- show them how to become readers.
